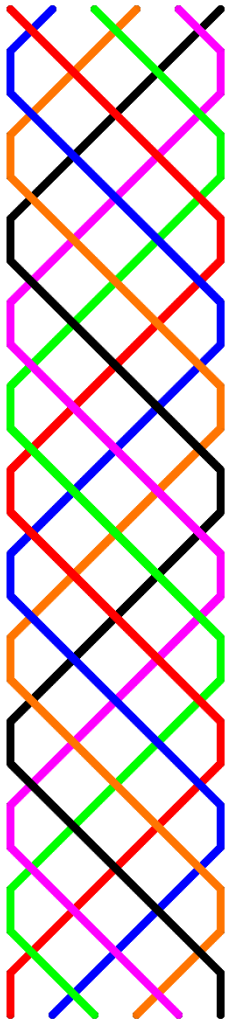


# Plain Hunt Minor



## Purpose

A progression from Plain Hunt Doubles, Plain Hunt Minor is rung on six bells.

Minor methods are usually rung 'uncovered' (without a tenor ringing behind), so bells coming into the lead will not have a covering bell to use as a reference when leading.

## Ringling Plain Hunt Minor

A preparatory step might be to try ringling Plain Hunt Doubles without a cover bell, to get used to ringling without a tenor.

In Plain Hunt Doubles, bells leaving the back at backstroke. Whilst in Plain Hunt Minor, bells leave the back at handstroke which can feel different.

Odd numbered bells start by hunting up to the back, even numbered bells start by hunting down to the lead.
