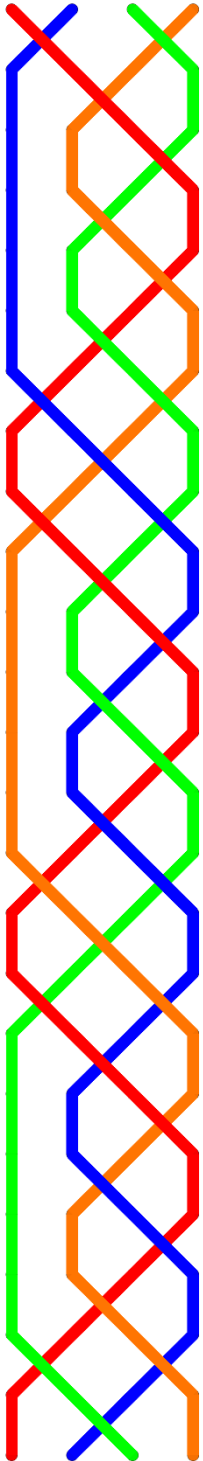


Reverse Court Minimus



Purpose

Reverse Court Minimus enables ringers who are familiar with Single Court to ring it in reverse.

There are clear treble signposts.

Staying in the lead for six blows offers plenty of chance to practise steady leading.

A new skill is hunting in and turning round in seconds place.

Ringing Reverse Court Minimus

The treble plain hunts.

When the treble takes you off the lead, stay in the lead for six blows until the treble appears again.

If hunting down, whenever the treble is *above*, turn round in seconds place and hunt back out.

If hunting down and the treble is *below*, hunt straight to the lead. The treble will be there to take you off lead.

Jargon

The treble being *above* means it is ringing later in the row than your bell.

The treble being *below* means it is ringing before your bell in the row.
